#### 2. Headline

Your headline should be a snapshot of your career goals and skills.

Example:

 *Marketing Student | Aspiring Digital Marketer | Passionate About Content Creation*

 *Computer Science Student | AI & Machine Learning Enthusiast*

#### 3. About Section (Summary)

Write a compelling summary that includes:

- ✓ Who you are (major, interests, goals)
- ✓ What you're passionate about
- ✓ Any relevant experience or skills
- ✓ Future aspirations

 **Example:**

*"I am a junior at XYZ University majoring in Computer Science with a passion for AI and software development. I have experience in Python, Java, and web development. Currently, I am seeking internship opportunities in software engineering to apply my skills in a professional setting."*

## **Step 2: Adding Your Experience & Skills**

- ✓ **Education** – List your university, major, expected graduation date
  - ✓ **Internships/Jobs** – Include job titles, responsibilities, and accomplishments
  - ✓ **Extracurriculars & Volunteering** – Clubs, leadership roles, community service
  - ✓ **Projects & Certifications** – Personal or academic projects, online courses (LinkedIn Learning, Coursera)
  - ✓ **Skills & Endorsements** – Add skills like communication, programming, marketing, and get endorsements from peers

- ✗ **Don't Ignore Messages from Recruiters** – Always reply politely, even if you're not interested.
- ✗ **Don't Post Irrelevant Content** – No memes, controversial topics, or personal rants.
- ✗ **Don't Ask for Jobs in Your First Message** – Instead, ask for career advice or mentorship.
- ✗ **Don't Neglect Your Activity Feed** – Stay engaged by posting updates and interacting with others.
