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LinkedIn Dos and Don’ts for High School Students

✓ Dos

- ✓ **Keep Your Profile Updated** – Add new experiences, awards, and skills regularly.
- ✓ **Connect with People You Know** – Teachers, classmates, mentors, family friends.
- ✓ **Engage with Content** – Like, comment, and share posts related to your interests.
- ✓ **Join Groups & Follow Pages** – Connect with industry professionals, schools, and companies.
- ✓ **Write Thoughtful Messages** – If reaching out to someone, introduce yourself and be polite.
- ✓ **Share Your Achievements** – Post about accomplishments, projects, or new skills.

✗ Don’ts

- ✗ **Don’t Use Unprofessional Photos** – Avoid selfies, group photos, or casual pictures.
- ✗ **Don’t Spam Connections** – Only connect with people you have a reason to engage with.
- ✗ **Don’t Leave Your Profile Empty** – A blank profile won’t attract opportunities.
- ✗ **Don’t Use Slang or Emojis** – Keep your language professional in posts and messages.
- ✗ **Don’t Overshare Personal Info** – No personal contact details or unnecessary private details.

- ⊘ **Don't Beg for Jobs or Internships** – Instead, ask for advice and guidance.
- ⊘ **Don't Post Inappropriate Content** – No memes, controversial opinions, or unrelated content.
- ⊘ **Don't Ignore Messages** – If someone reaches out professionally, respond politely.
